DEMO Sight Translations – English to Spanish

Francisco Rivera Madera pleaded guilty to a single-count indictment for illegal reentry in which he is solely named. Mr. Rivera had been previously convicted in state court for lewd and lascivious acts with a minor.

On December 7, 2004, a special agent evaluated the defendant and determined him to potentially be an illegal alien. His state court file was reviewed and contained a photo that matched the person convicted in this case. During the interview, in the presence of counsel, the defendant displayed no obvious signs of any psychological disorder. However, the probation officer believes that psychological treatment may be necessary to resolve any underlying issue that may have led to his original conviction.

Mr. Rivera's schooling consists of studies up to the third grade in Guatemala. He has worked for the last four years with the same employer as a bricklayer, while moonlighting with his stepbrother doing light plumbing.

Mr. Rivera's degree of cultural assimilation is insufficient to mitigate the severity of his illegal reentry. He has no family or community ties, and returned to the United States essentially due to financial considerations. In fact, he specifically stated that he couldn't make ends meet back home. However, the relatively minor nature of the aggravated felony may warrant a downward departure under the sentencing guidelines.
